BIJOU THEATRE

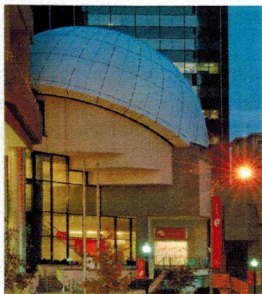
Ishihara by Yoav Brill

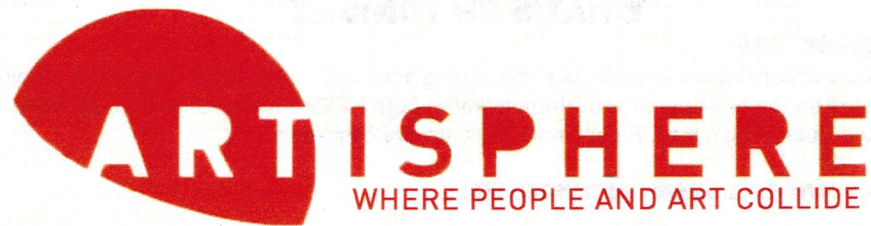
